HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS TO WORLD WAR II
AND KOREAN CONFLICT VETERANS

Any person who wishes to obtain a high school diploma for an individual, living or deceased, who left high school to serve in World War II or Korean Conflict and who meets the criteria listed below, should contact the County Veterans' Services Office at (740) 368 - 1770.

This office will provide the application that is to be completed and returned. Upon receipt of the application, the County Veterans' Services Office will verify service and eligibility, pursuant to State law. The application will then be forwarded to the school from which the veteran, or applicant on behalf of the veteran, is requesting the high school diploma.

To be eligible for a diploma, all of the following criteria must be met:

- A. The veteran is a current resident of the State of Ohio or was previously enrolled in any high school in this State.
- B. The veteran either left a public or nonpublic school located in any state prior to graduation:
 - 1. in order to serve in the armed forces of the United States;
 - 2. due to family circumstances and subsequently entered the armed forces of the United States.

To qualify, the veteran must have served at any time during the period of September 16, 1940 and December 31, 1946 and/or June 25, 1950 and July 27, 1953 in any branch of the armed forces of the United States including:

- 1. United States Army Air Corps;
- 2. United States Air Force;
- 3. United States Army;
- 4. United States Coast Guard;
- 5. United States Marine-Corps;
- 6. United States Navy.
- C. The veteran received an honorable discharge from the armed forces of the United States as verified by the original or a copy of the DD 214 or other proof of service.
- D. The veteran has not been granted a high school diploma, a diploma of adult education, or a diploma under this provision.
